1 LAUREL PARK	19	Active	Active and passive recreation facilities, including baseball fields, a softball field, 2 tee-ball fields, 3 batting cages, a soccer field, a football field, 2 pickle ball courts and walking trails. Sports teams use March through December.
2 CANAL PARK	11	Active and Passive	One full size multi-purpose playing field used primarily for soccer, a large practice field area, open and wooded areas for passive recreation, walking trails , and the Malcolm P. Crooks pedestrian footbridge which crosses over the Delaware Canal.
3 MAGILL'S HILL	4.9	Passive/ Special Purpose	Sledding, picnic table. Large sculpture.
4 SOLEBURY PARK TRAIL	1.5 miles	Passive	Walking, jogging, and bicycle
5 PAT LIVEZEY PARK	17.6	Active	Soccer field, a playground, walking trail, . An open-air, stone pavilion with picnic tables and grill, .a lighted soccer field and a lighted multi-purpose practice field which was designed to be used as a natural amphitheatre / concert area.
6 NORTH POINTE PARK	30	Active	Designated for active recreation use to satisfy the developer's parks and recreation requirements. Not yet developed.

7 AQUETONG SPRING PARK	48.3	Passive	Nature and Heritage Preserve, trails.
8 SOLEBURY PARK	80	Active and Passive	A preliminary "concept plan" was prepared through a series of public meetings. Not yet developed.

An **Active Park** is a park containing one or more sporting fields or that actively encourages physical activity through infrastructure.

A **Passive Park** is a park that is principally designed for use in an unstructured or informal way. No sport equipment or structures.

One playing field has been added to Park and Rec since the last comprehensive plan. Current demographics shift reduces need for two fields. The Delaware Canal State Park provides a 60-mile long towpath designated as a National Historic Hiking Trail for walking, jogging or biking

Bowman's Hill Wildflower Preserve occupies 100 acres devoted to the preservation of native plants of Pennsylvania.

Honey Hollow Nautre Center is 110 acres.
