- Identifies objectives within each category.
- Multiple actions listed for each objective.
- Co-Benefits identified to show additional positive impact of proposed actions.



Local Law 97 (LL97) compliance begins in 2024, but implementing energy management strategies for your multifamily properties doesn't happen overnight, so the time to plan is now. 



Main <u>Areas of Focus</u>

- County Operations Sustainability Plan
- Develop an actionable plan that makes working sustainably the default action
- Reduce the resources County operations requires for day-to-day work
- Local Climate Action Program
- Create an actionable plan that incorporates extensive input from county residents that allows all voices be heard
- Incorporate Mitigation, Adaptation, and Environmental Justice strategies





Local Climate Action Program

The Local Climate Action Program (LCAP) is an excellent opportunity. It is a partnership with Penn State University and fully funded by the PA DEP though an ICLEI grant program. Counties and local municipalities are paired with Penn State professors and students where, over the course of a year, they provide you with manpower (students) and technical assistance (through ICLEI Local Governments for Sustainability) to calculate your emissions and create a draft climate action plan for your community.

The current cycle (which we are on) is from July 2022 to June 2023. July 2022 to December 2022 is where emissions are calculated and January 2023 to June 2023 is where the Local Climate Action Plan is developed.

Any PA County, Township, or Borough can sign up through the PA DEP's website.






Other Projects

- Restart Ready-for-100 Committee
- Regional Power Purchase Agreement to provide County government energy requirements
- Model Renewable Energy Ordinance & Model Regional Solar Ordinance (Draft)
- Improve solar access throughout the county by achieving a Sol-Smart designation giving knowledge, technical assistance, and streamlining the process to acquire solar panels within the county
- Gain municipal insight through Intra-county sustainability discussions
- Researching how climate driven microbursts affect local flooding and emergency response budgets (PEMA)
